On April 17, 2025, NARCOG's Planning and Development staff proudly participated in the groundbreaking ceremony for the Lawrence County Career Technical Center (LCCTC) Expansion Project in Moulton, Alabama. This significant milestone marks the beginning of a transformative initiative aimed at enhancing educational opportunities and workforce development in the region. chian Regional Commission (ARC) SAAW grant secured with NAR-COG's assistance, will introduce a new wing featuring a modern entrance, additional classrooms, and state-of-the-art labs dedicated to welding, industrial maintenance, and advanced manufacturing programs. These facilities are designed to provide students with hands-on experience and training in high-demand technical fields, directly aligning with the evolving needs of local industries.

NARCOG is currently administering the ARC grant, ensuring that the project progresses smoothly and meets its objectives. The expansion is expected to significantly impact the lives of Lawrence County students by equipping them with the skills and knowledge necessary to thrive in today's competitive job market.

The groundbreaking ceremony was attended by local officials, educators, and community members, all celebrating the collaborative effort to invest in the county's future. This project exemplifies the power of partnerships between regional councils, educational institutions, and federal agencies in driving economic growth and improving quality of life.

## **NARCOG Attends State of the City with Mayor Bowling**

## **PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION**

The NARCOG Transit Agency operates an urban public transportation system within the Decatur Urban Area. The purpose of this service is to provide mobility opportunities to individuals of all ages and abilities in collaboration with the City of Decatur and the Federal Transit Administration.

- Call 256-580-2088 to schedule a ride at least 24 hours in advance
- Wheelchair-accessible vehicles are available
- Each one-way ride costs \$2
- Connect Cards (prepaid punch cards) can be purchased at the main office or on a transit vehicle for \$20
- Ride Operations are Monday through Friday from 7 AM to 5 PM
- Ride Scheduling is Monday through Friday from 7:30 AM to 4 PM
